> look forward to getting to know them all and see them thrive.


As for me, the time has come to say good-bye. I leave SET Felix with wonderful memories and hope to hear news of many more successes next year!

Keep practising your reading - don't forget there is a super library in Felixstowe with lots of books and activities to choose from.






Elder: We can't quite believe that we are coming to the end of another year, and what a year it has been!

Keep on reading over the summer and enjoy the sun whenever it shines!!

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
