We have worked on improvisation in our acting and been doing 'tiger-obics' in our dancing.










School Council

Specialist Support Units: Pine

Wow, we cannot believe how fast time has sprung and Spring term has nearly finished. We would like to think the children have had a lot of fun on their learning journey as well as improving their life skills and independence.

Stone

We spent a long time exploring our own bodies in Science and PSHE, understanding the location of certain organs and bones and what to do if we are hurt, physically and mentally. This knowledge has developed into learning about the skeletons in certain animal groupsplease ask your children what an exoskeleton is and where it is found on a snail.

As the weather is improving, the children have been gardening, trying to grow fruit and vegetables from seeds. This is all new to Miss Hart, so thankfully Mrs. Fish and Miss Summers were on hand for advice. As I write this, there are sprouts growing and of course, I will keep you updated.

In mathematics, we have spent a long time understanding the value, adding and subtracting money. To embed their knowledge, we created a shop outside where the children can buy fruit and vegetables using money. When you take your children food shopping, see how much they know about money. They have worked hard on this concept and their perseverance has certainly been displayed.

Finally, the children loved reading The Wolves in the Wall. Stopping at certain points nd creating suspense has been the highlight, it is wonderful to see so much enthusiasm from the children. They are working hard on their retrieval skills.

A big focus from the school is presentation, so we are having handwriting sessions, writing the full date in their books and targeting capital letters and full stops, but in Pine we also understand that this is a big ask;

"Little things make big things happen." Identifying, understanding and embedding those little steps is a massive achievement for our wonderful children in Pine. Each one of them has made a significant development, and that is thanks to all their hard work in class and at home. It is certainly a team effort, so thank you to all the incredible staff in Pine and to parents/guardians at home. We hope you have a lovely break, and we look forward to seeing you in Summer.



Specialist Support Units: Poplar

We have had a wonderful half term where the children have engaged in many exciting learning activities.

As the weather has started to improve, we have enjoyed watching the daffodil bulbs spring to life around us. We have very much enjoyed being able to get into the forest school area where we have enjoyed working on our own individual projects whilst gaining a deeper understanding of the nature around us.

In maths, some of us have been learning about lighter-heavier, smaller-larger, taller-shorter. We have had a lot of fun learning about new mathematical vocabulary and using it correctly in testing ourselves.

Some of us have been learning about fractions and whilst we found converting improper fractions into mixed numbers, we persevered and showed an incredible growth mindset whilst showing resilience showing dedication in our school values.

Literacy has seen us complete lots of narrative writing based on different texts as well as some diary writing. A small group have enjoyed narratives such as the Rainbow Fish as well as All Aboard the London Bus. We loved learning about the important landmarks in London. The children immersed themselves in The Great Fire of London and produced wonderful diary writing entries. The children impressed us all and we are very proud of the learning they produced.

We have continued to learn all about the Ancient Egyptians in humanities and we enjoyed being able to replicate sentences using the hieroglyphics which they used. We also enjoyed creating our own alphabet using our imaginations and encouraged each other to work out the messages we had scribed. Of course, we thoroughly enjoyed learning about mummification and replicating this process on smalls dolls.

Science has seen us learning about life cycles and we have had so much fun learning about the important development stages in our lives. We have also enjoyed learning about the life cycle of plants and watching the growth of plants in our own school gardens.

We will continue to use Numbots, Times Tables Rockstars and Lexia to support your children at starter activities in the mornings and afternoons. We encourage your children to also complete learning on these apps at home. We would also all like to become timetables experts and would appreciate it if you continued to support your children in this area at home.

We cannot wait to continue to share all our exciting learning experiences and achievements with you, and we will continue to do so on dojo. Feel free to contact a team member at any point if you have any questions.

Specialist Support Units: Elm

We had a fantastic half term where the children engaged in lots of fabulous activities. We have been thinking about Spring, learning about spring lambs and how the trees and plants change. It has been great to watch the daffodils growing around us.

In Maths, some of us have been thinking all about subtraction. We have been talking about all the different ways to say subtraction. We have been learning about methods that can help us with subtraction problems, we have mastered using number lines, part and whole models, using our fingers and even thinking in our heads!

Some of us have been thinking about place value and the order of numbers, we have had a lot of fun in our maths sessions playing lots of number ordering games!

In our PE sessions we have been focusing on ways to move. We have been balancing, running, jumping and skipping. We have had fun going round obstacle courses which even helped our catching, throwing and aiming skills. Well done Elm!

We had so much fun in our phonics sessions. In Blue Group we have been learning all about our tricky red words, we are becoming fantastic at spelling these! In Green Group we have been focusing on our set 2 sounds and using these sounds to segment and blend words. In Purple Group we are having the best time with our phonics bucket, the children love experiencing sensory objects whilst learning about sounds.

We have been very busy in Art. We began the term making spring lambs whilst talking about Spring. The children loved decorating their lamb and adding it to our garland. We also made a class rainbow using a paper chain; they all did so well! We also used paint and glitter to create our own Easter designs, it was so lovely to see all the vibrant creations the children made, some even made more than one to create an Easter egg basket!

Within our class discussions we have been thinking about Pancake Day – which the children loved. This was followed by a Pancake Day tuff tray, the children enjoyed making their own pancakes and it was amazing to see all the imagination in their flavour combinations. We also discussed Mother's Day; the children all spoke about the best ways to show appreciation for the grown-ups in our lives, some ideas included making art, baking cakes and cuddles!

We hope the children have a lovely Easter holiday and look forward to welcoming them back in the summer term and all the exciting learning opportunities which await them.

Cherry

Just as the blossom is appearing on the trees, the children in our class have been coming into blossom too, working hard on their learning and developing all of the different skills they will need as they progress up through the school.

In maths, we have enjoyed learning to calculate the perimeters of different shapes, even when we don't know the lengths of all of the sides! Most recently, we have been fractions experts — we can tell you what fraction of a shape has been shaded, what fraction of a litre there is in a jug and we can use a fractions wall to compare different fractions. We are continuing to build our confidence with our times tables.

In English, our writing tasks have included penning poems about a mischievous thief who steals the plumpness of pillows, the stickiness of toffees and the crunchiness of cornflakes from our houses. And when the newsletter goes to press, we will have authored our own stories about a day when a trip to the beach is cut short by a fierce storm!

In guided reading, we have loved hearing about the adventures of Picklewitch. Thankfully, none of the children have tried to turn us into a frog or a mouse! Yet!

In science we have been exploring light sources and to celebrate Science Week we also carried out an experiment to test the effect of friction on moving vehicles.

We have spent some time using the Chromebooks in computing and developing our skills on Scratch. Humanities has given us the opportunities to explore ancient Egyptians and climate and weather.

We wish you a very happy Easter holiday and we will look forward to welcoming you back to the classroom refreshed and ready to learn.







Rowan

It has been another wonderfully busy term in Rowan class.

We have loved learning about fractions in maths and are becoming experts at converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa. We have also used fraction walls to find equivalent fractions and add 2 or more fractions.

In our English lessons we enjoyed reading 'Farther' and we were super impressed with the independent writing the children produced, continuing the storyline with their own ideas. We have also been travel agents and produced some persuasive writing too – well done everyone!

Our science topics this term have included sound and electricity. We especially enjoyed exploring how we could change the pitch of different instruments and learning about the inner workings of the ear! During our electricity unit, we have learnt how to make an electrical circuit with a battery, a light and a switch.

As part of Science Week, we became chemists, investigating whether large or small particles of material dissolved fastest in water. We used sugar cubes, granulated and caster sugar!

We have also learnt how careful we must be with batteries, especially button batteries which can be swallowed by children and babies. We learnt that these should always be kept well out of reach.

A definite highlight of the term has been learning the ukelele in our weekly music lessons. We have loved learning various songs and everyone has showed resilience as learning an instrument isn't always easy!

We have continued to focus on our school values of achievement, resilience and kindness and as always, we see these in action every day. Keep it up!

The year 4 Multiplication Check is edging nearer – we are continuing to practice each day to help everyone reach their potential. Keep on keeping on – lots of TTRS practice at home please to support this.

In English, the children have written some fantastic poems. In Mrs. White's group we wrote about animals that do things that annoy us and in Mr. Humphrey's group they wrote about their favourite animals. In maths, the children explored fractions, decimals and percentages using lots of different resources. This then led us to perimeters areas where we got to use our multiplication skills and Mrs. White even put a cheeky decimal number to extend our learning!

The children really enjoyed DT - food technology, this half term with Mr. Humphrey. I have loved hearing, seeing and even tasting some of their homemade pizzas and hedgehog bread.

We also had science week and as we were looking at the human body, we decided to look at why we should only flush the three p's down the toilet. The children explored, predicted, observed and monitored the effects of different materials and gave reasons for why only the 3 p's are to be flushed down the toilet.

As always please remember to read 4 times a week, reading diaries are checked on a Tuesday and access TTRS at least 10 minutes a week, this is also checked on a Tuesday.

I am so impressed with all the children's learning and their progression this term; you truly deserve a fabulous break and can't wait to see what next term offers.
