If you would like to donate cakes, please could these be in school by the Monday the 2nd of June.


All the money raised will go towards outdoor equipment for the children to use at break and lunch.






P.E and Sports Clubs

Wow! What a short but busy half term. The children have been busy and enjoying all their learning tasks!




In English we have been focusing on Narratives and improving upon our own retelling of stories. The children have been show-casing their understanding using complex sentences and rich vocabulary. The children enjoyed 'The Way Back Home' using some super adjectives and adverbs.

Maths has seen some tricky concepts, including decimals and money. I am super proud of the resilience the children have shown, even when they find it incredibly challenging. The Year 4s have been working extra hard on their timetables. We have also continued to use TTRS and Numbots to help us.

We are excited to be learning about the weather and climate zones in Humanities. We have also set up experiments to see how much rainfall we have had. We are pleased to report that it has been a drier than usual month. We will continue with our experiments after half term.

All the staff in Poplar class hope you have an amazing week, and we look forward to returning to finishing off another successful school year with lots of fantastic progress and learning.







Specialist Support Units: Elm

What a super short half term we've had! The children have been very busy this half term enjoying all of their learning opportunities.

In phonics, Blue group have been continuing to focus on our tricky words, and we are beginning to build sentences using our super phonics knowledge. In Green group, we are continuing to secure our knowledge of our set 2 sounds and have really been focusing on segmenting and blending CVC words, the children are becoming super blenders! In Purple group, we are having lots of fun with our phonics themed bucket every day. The children adore exploring the exciting resources in the bucket whilst learning about sounds! In maths we have been doing a variety of activities in our maths groups. In Blue group, we have been focusing on number order and what happens when we add one more. The children have enjoyed participating in maths stories and have loved our character, the mischievous monkey, who always adds one more. In Purple group we have been looking at all things shapes. The children have had so much fun exploring, creating and building with lots of different shapes.

We covered the topic relationships in our PSHE sessions this term. We have participated in a range of activities, discussions and stories which helped us understand what it means to be a good friend as well as solving friendship problems when they happen. It has been absolutely wonderful to see the children take what we discuss in PSHE and put it into practice – we have had lots of cheering each other on this term. I am very proud of everyone.

Every week in RE we have been reading a story from different religions and beliefs, the children have enjoyed these very much and now look forward to our weekly sessions, often asking what story we will be reading before the lesson even begins! The children even got to ask Mrs. Hussain some questions about her religion when we read our Muslim story Bilal and the beautiful Butterfly which was amazing to see how curious the children were. All the staff in Elm class hope you all have a fantastic week off and look forward to welcoming all the children back for the last term of the year where there will be even more fabulous learning opportunities. K.S 1

Acorn

We have had another busy and exciting half term in Acorns. We have had a huge push on phonics and writing and the progress of the children is clearly evident in their work. Many of the children are now secure with their set 2 sounds and are applying this to their writing.

In Write Stuff we read Chocolate Cake by Michael Rosen and used this as inspiration for writing instructions for making a chocolate mug cake. We then read Ruby's Worry.

In maths we have been practicing counting to 20 using bead strings. We have also been continuing to use doubles and to think about odds and evens. We have started to use the language of add and take away and have been doing this in lots of different ways.

Our topic has been changing and growing and the children have been discovering the life cycles of frogs, butterflies and hens. We made a beautiful 3D display in the corridor showing these lifecycles which used an array of different media and techniques. We have also been thinking about how humans change as they grow from babies to adults.

The children have done lovely observational and still life drawings where they have demonstrated excellent pencil control and observational skills.

We learnt all about VE day and celebrated this by making our own flags.











Cedar

In Cedar class we have been exploring the outside area as we learn about plants. We have looked at the different parts of trees and looked for wild flowers, we painted pictures, completed observational drawing of leaves and planted a variety of plants in the new raised bed.

We have also spent time outside to help us with our English. We have completed a non-fiction text about seasons and whilst being outside e have used our senses to think of adjectives to make our writing more exciting.

In Maths we have been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We have then been using this knowledge to make arrays and complete basic multiplication problems. Everyone in Cedar class can tell you how many strawberries are in 3 boxes, if there are 5 in each box.

We have been learning about different relationships in our PSHE lessons, thinking about who is in our family, how we should care of our friends and who in school we should go to if we need help.











Elder

Summer 1 has gone in a flash!

It has been a lovely half term filled with lots of fun activities and a super school trip! In English we have been focusing on the story of Plop the nervous owl. We have been trying really hard to ensure our sentences have capital letters, full stops and that they make sense. We have thoroughly enjoyed reading and writing about Plops adventures and look forward to creating our own story around Plop.

In maths we have been finding fractions of amount. The children have worked hard to remember what the denominator is. We now need to work just as hard to remember how important the numerator is when finding a fraction of an amount.

In science we have been researching different animals and their habitats. We have discussed the different adaptations the animals may have to be able to survive in their habitat. We used this information to support our learning at Colchester Zoo. Where we were lucky enough to see multiple animals enjoying the sunshine.

We now look forward to our final half term in Elder class, we cannot wait to see the children continue to flourish whilst following our school rules – being ready, respectful and safe. Showcasing our school values – pride, achievement, resilience and kindness.











K.S 2

Cherry

Summer 1 seems to have zoomed by. We have been delighted to welcome two new children to the class – well done, Cherries, for helping them to settle in so quickly!

In English, we have been writing narrative based on the story of The Happy Prince, by Oscar Wilde. about a beautiful statue of a prince covered in gold and precious jewels. He sees the suffering of the poor in his city and finds a way, through a kindhearted sparrow, to help them. We are almost ready to write our own versions of The Last Bear, in which April befriends a polar bear and they go an adventure together. We have worked on lots of key English skills, such as including fronted adverbials, direct speech and adjectives in our writing. I've included a link to a guide below which you might find helpful.

In maths, we have continued our work on mass and capacity, and we are currently deepening our understanding of fractions. Most excitingly, we are working very hard on our times tables. This is because becoming fluent in these supports so many other areas of maths. Times Table Rock Stars is an excellent resource – log on with your child today and prepare to be wowed! In French, we have been re-visiting some of our earlier learning on greeting each other and introducing ourselves, as well as learning how to talk about our families!

In RE, we have continued to deepen our understanding of Christianity.

In Science we have been exploring parts and more specifically the functions of the different parts of the plants. Cherry Class are looking forward to having the opportunity to dissect some plants!

Computing has seen us explore with creating media and using different fonts, sizes and colours of texts for different purposes.

In History we have continued our work on Ancient Egypt and spent some time looking at hieroglypics and using these to write our own names which was great fun, some children were grateful to have shorter names!

In music we have explored Jazz music and had a go playing a piece of Jazz whilst following a piece of music

Art has given us the opportunity to create moving pictures. We have been able to design our own through the research we have carried out on others and thought carefully about what we liked and what we would like to include on our own pictures.

Maple

Wow! That was a short but full half term!

In English, the children have written some great narratives based on the book, The Nowhere Emporium. Mr. Humphrey and myself have enjoyed reading them and seeing the children's imagination come alive as well as how much they have progressed this year.

In maths, we have been looking at shape specifically angles and length and recapping on some prior knowledge. The children were exposed to protractors and practiced using them, which built up our accuracy skills.

During science, we have investigated the reproductive system. We touched on the male and female organs and then did an in-depth study into identifying the sexual reproduction system on plants. The children dissected flowers to examine the female and male parts.

Our year 6s, had SATs and residential this half term, we are super proud of them and can't wait to hear about their time at Thorpe Woodlands.

To link in with VE day, we have been learning about World War II and how technology advanced from WWI. We have decided to link this in with a trip and we will be visiting Landguard Fort on 13th June to look at artifacts and hear about the challenges people faced in WWI and WWII.

As you read this, we've just got back from residential, and we can't wait to tell you all about it in our next newsletter!














Inclusions
